Studying in the United Kingdom

THE UNITED KINGDOM

consists of England, Wales, Scotland (which together make up Great Britain) and Northern Ireland. UK degrees have a global reputation for quality and employers worldwide recognise a UK degree as a sign of high academic standards.

- The 2013/14 QS World University Rankings found that **employers worldwide consider UK graduates among the most 'employable'**. From a global survey of 27,000 graduate employers, **five UK universities were ranked in the top 10**.
- According to the Tracking International Graduate Outcomes study (BIS, 2011), UK-educated international graduates achieve markedly **higher average salaries** than if they had been educated at home.
- One of the reasons employers value UK qualifications is the **focus on skills for the workplace**. The UK ranks second in the world for university-industry collaboration (Annual Innovation Report, BIS, 2012).
- The UK is a **multicultural society**, and UK campuses are international communities. By studying in the UK you'll gain an **international perspective**, learn about **new cultures** and socialise with **students and teachers from around the world** – valuable experience for a career in an international company.

Each year, thousands of international students successfully gain a visa to study in the United Kingdom. **The UK government welcomes international students**, and there is no limit on the number of student visas that can be issued.

Living in the United Kingdom

Living costs and tuition fees do vary greatly across the UK. Before you enrol in a course, it is recommended that you contact your chosen school, college or university for full details. It's best to ask exactly what is included in their fees, and if there are any additional costs to consider.

The British Council runs 'pre-departure briefings' in many countries for students who are planning to study in the UK. At these events, British Council

staff give you advice about what to pack, travelling to the UK, settling in and much more. For further details on these briefings, visit www.educationuk.org. Your chosen UK school, college or university may also run pre-departure briefings in selected cities around the world. Education UK and the British Council also organise regular events where you can meet face-to-face with representatives from UK schools, colleges and universities.
